


Woolaroc Museum Activities

Cub Scouts TIGER Animal Charades


- Den leaders divide your group into 6 or less scouts and have your group sit in a circle outside.

Wild Boar:




TP: What did the native Americans use wild boar for?

Buffalo:




TP: Name 3 things Native Americans could make from a Buffalo.
