Woolaroc welcomes Eagle Scout candidates who are interested in completing service projects that support our museum, wildlife preserve, educational mission, visitor experience, and stewardship of the property. We are excited to work with Scouts whose projects create lasting value for our guests, staff, and grounds.

WHY WOOLAROC IS A STRONG EAGLE PROJECT SITE:

- Large, visible site with lasting community impact
- Opportunities for outdoor, educational, conservation, and visitor-service projects
- Projects that can demonstrate planning and leadership
- A unique and respected local organization
- Work that helps preserve history, nature, and public access

PROJECT IDEAS:

• TRAIL AND GROUNDS IMPROVEMENTS:

Trail markers, wayfinding signs, erosion control features, seating areas, cleanup and beautification projects, invasive plant removal, native planting zones.

• VISITOR EXPERIENCE PROJECTS:

Benches, picnic areas, shade structures, brochure holders, interpretive signage, map displays, directional signage.

• EDUCATIONAL AND INTERPRETIVE PROJECTS:

Wildlife education displays, history-focused signage, exhibit support materials, outdoor learning stations.

• CONSERVATION AND HABITAT PROJECTS:

Pollinator gardens, habitat enhancement, bird or bat houses if appropriate, planting projects, stewardship-related improvements.

• ACCESSIBILITY AND PUBLIC-USE IMPROVEMENTS:

Rest areas, path improvements where appropriate, accessible seating or informational features.

We welcome Scout-developed ideas as well as interest in current needs identified by Woolaroc staff.

SITE-SPECIFIC CONSTRAINTS AND EXPECTATIONS:

- All projects must be reviewed and approved by Woolaroc before planning proceeds
- Certain areas may be environmentally sensitive, historically significant, or restricted
- Projects must align with site safety rules and visitor operations
- Materials, design, placement, colors, and signage style may need approval
- Adult supervision requirements must follow BSA policies and site expectations
- Some tools, equipment, digging, concrete work, or vehicle access may be limited
- Project schedules may need to work around events, weather, staffing, and visitor traffic
- Submission of an idea or inquiry does not guarantee project approval. All Eagle Scout project concepts must be reviewed for mission fit, safety, site suitability, timing, and available staff support.

HOW TO GET STARTED

- Send an inquiry email with your name, troop, unit leader contact, and project interest
 1. Full name
 2. Troop number and city
 3. Scoutmaster or unit leader name and contact info
 4. Parent/guardian contact info if appropriate
 5. Short description of the project idea or area of interest
 6. Target timeline
 7. Whether you are seeking a site-provided idea or proposing your own
- Woolaroc will schedule an initial conversation or site discussion if the idea seems like a fit
- The Scout develops the project proposal
- Final site approval is required before work begins
