This statue was originally commissioned by the Governor of Oklahoma. It is modeled after Mrs. John Bull, a Cherokee woman. It was purchased by Frank Philips in 1941. Sculpted by Jo Mora in 1928, a California Artist who studied Native American culture.

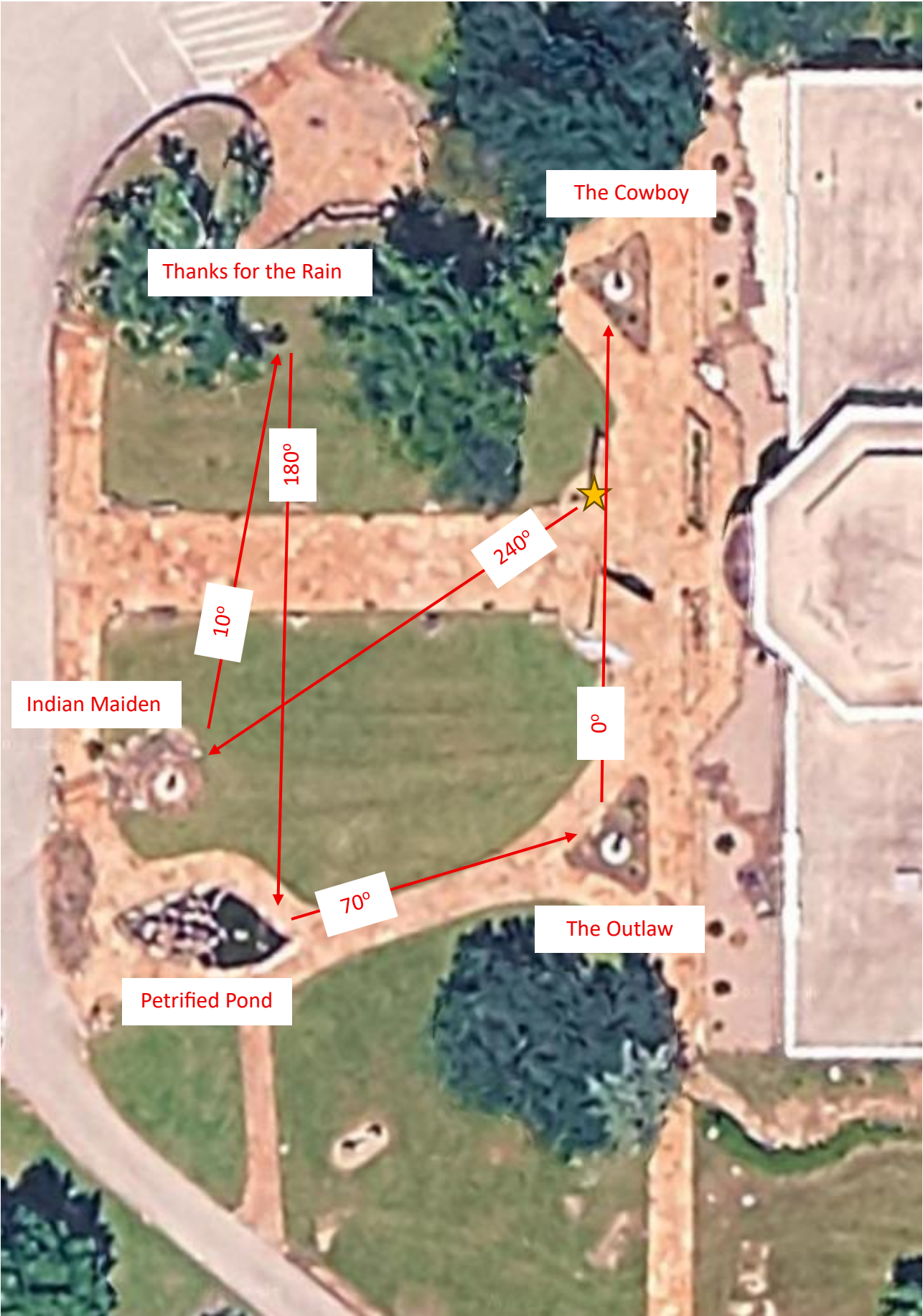
